PUNJAB ACT No. III OF 1912.

PASSED BY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR OF THE
PUNJAB IN COUNCIL.

RECEIVED the assent of His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor on the 31st March 1912, and that of His Excellency the Viceroy and Governor-General on the 22nd April 1912; the Governor-General's assent was first published in the *Punjab Gazette* of the 24th May 1912.

THE PUNJAB TENANCY AMENDMENT ACT, 1912.

An Act further to amend the Punjab Tenancy Act, 1887.

WHEREAS it is expedient further to amend the Punjab Tenancy Act, 1887; it is hereby enacted as follows:—

1. This Act may be called the Punjab Tenancy Amendment Act, 1912.

2. To section 77 (3) of the Punjab India Act Tenancy Act, 1887, there shall be added the XVI of 1887. following proviso, namely:—

“ Provided that—

(1) where in a suit cognizable by

Procedure where revenue matter is raised in a Civil Court. and instituted in a Civil Court it

becomes necessary to decide any matter which can under this sub-section be heard and determined only by a Revenue Court the Civil Court shall endorse upon the plaint the nature of the matter for decision and the particulars required by Order VII, rule 10, Civil Procedure Code, and return the plaint for presentation to the Collector;

(2) on the plaint being presented to the Collector the Collector shall proceed to hear and determine the suit where the value thereof exceeds Rs. 1,000 or the matter involved is of the nature mentioned in section 77 (3), First Group, of the Punjab Tenancy Act, 1887, and in other cases may send the suit to an Assistant Collector of the first grade for decision.
